DOCTRINE OF ADULTERY

- I. Vocabulary:
 - **A.** Hebrew:
 - 1. 783 na-aph; verb; to commit adultery.
 - 2. בוה zanah; verb; commit adultery, commit harlotry, to fornicate.
 - 3. ברי nakeriy; adj; adulteress, adulterous woman.
 - **B.** Greek:
 - 1. μοιχεύω moicheuo; verb; to commit adultery.
 - 2. μοιχάω moichao; verb; to commit adultery with.
 - 3. μοιχαλίς moichalis; adj./fem.; adultery, an adulteress
 - **4.** μοιχός moichos; noun/masc.; adulterers
- **II.** Adultery is prohibited by the Word of God. Exo.20:14; Deut.5:18; Eph.5:3. Adultery is when one or both sex partners are married. 1Cor.6:18; Col.3:5
- III. Mental attitude adultery is also prohibited. Mat.5:27,28 cp.2Pet.2:14
- IV. Adultery is a bona fide basis for divorce, but is not commanded. Mat.5:32; 19:9; Luk.6:18
- V. It was a basis for capital punishment under the Mosaic Law. Lev.20:10
- VI. The law of jealousy was also designed to curb it. Num.5:1-31
- VII. Adultery is used to describe the interaction between the Real You and the STA/BC (sinful trend of Adam/brain computer), and as such constitutes spiritual adultery.
 - **A.** Before saving faith Ph₁ (Rom.7:3; cp. vs.5), the STA cannot produce anything to take the place of the SAJG.
 - **B.** In the believer as per carnality, the STA cannot produce a substitute for the R_BAJG . Jam.1:13-15; 4:4.
 - C. The initial sin begins the affair with the STA and additional sinning continues it.
- **VIII.** It is used to describe Israel in reversionism.
 - **A.** Phallic reversionism. Jer.3; Eze.16:23-43; 23:24-28; Hos.4:13.
 - **B.** It is associated with their religious reversionism., Rom.2:17-29
- IX. It is the basis for the sin unto death (Heb.13:4; Rev.2:22) and the loss of SG₃. 1Cor.6:9
- **X.** It is a sign of national decay (Hos.4:13) and internationalism via Religious and Political Babylon (Rev.17-18 esp.vss.3,9).
